WDFP has been working in the slums of Karachi especially in Lyari, coastal area of Kemari and Bin Qasim Town on multiple issues in development sector. WDFP has an active network of civil society organizations that supports developmental activities.

# <u>LIGHT-F (Livelihood Improvement for Growth and Transformation of the Women-JICA):</u>

- January 2020: Registration completed of Home-Based Workers
- February 2020: Baseline survey completed of selected participants
- March 2020: Youth Leader visit in different organizations but delay due to COVID-19
- 6 February 2020: Gathering for conferment of certificate on promoting women for employment to Youth Leaders of Maripur and Baldia Karachi was held under the Project for Improvement of Livelihoods and Well-being of Female Home-Based Workers in the Informal Sector in Sindh Province (Light-F), (A Project of Women Development Foundation Pakistan (WDFP) supported by Women Development Department Sindh and JICA. TAF Foundation, Charter for Compassion and UNDP representative also brief their organizations training programs on the occasion at Lincoln's Corner Karachi.

Due to Covid-19 project activities were halted from March to June 2020. So there was no progress in this period. However the project team was in coordination and planned to resume activities with SOPs.

Team resumed the project in July 2020 and started to gather resources and took necessary steps to continue activities on the field. A session was conducted for the project beneficiaries as "Awareness of Covid-19" in which it was observed how the community was affected in lockdown and

what are the new norms. Keeping these observations in mind, a series of training sessions were designed as "Importance of Digitalization". 4 sessions were conducted in area centers

for the beneficiaries to engage them and project activities and educate them about beneficial usage of mobile for their businesses.

Meanwhile, the project team got finalized. 2 area coordinators were taken on board for areas Baldia and Maripur. Also a Social Mobilizer for Baldia also hired to run the mobilization activities effectively.

Furthermore, it has been planned to conduct a series of online sessions with project participants so that they could cope up with the current scenario of pandemic.

In November-December 2020 team organized session

for the Maripur and Baldia community to aware them about the benefits of formal employment. However, JICA project team would not be able to visit Pakistan till December 2020, so the project activities will be monitored by the WDFP project team. Project training will start from January 2021 tentatively.

## **Nawabad Youth Center:**

After lockdown online sessions with community were done with participants and stakeholders on Corona virus awareness, revision of training topics (Motivational and Educational), Social Media awareness and video messages by participants.

In COVID-19 period lockdown was imposed due to which center activities were halted. Team engaged beneficiaries online, conducted sessions, meetings and SAP's online via zoom and Facebook

applications. Further it was extended for one month till 10 September than again donor extended for further 3 Months till December for completion of project activities. Team successfully completed trainings and trained total 60 beneficiaries throughout the project and team strictly followed the SOP's.

# Azm e Naujawan Phase III:

Azme-Naujawan (AeN), a collaborative initiative of 8 civil Society organizations to provide training regarding Personal and Professional Development and create social & civil responsibility to marginalized Youth of Karachi. In this Project, the youth have identified their community issues and challenges and found the solutions in the form of Social Action Projects and Social Campaigning. Throughout the Project the WDFP Trainers and Team

have trained 390 Youth of Maripur and Baldia. The

youth engaged the community stakeholders and completed 400 Social Action Project and Social Campaigning with the support of Trainers and WDFP team. From the first day of LOCKDOWN AeN team and participants actively conducted live sessions including; Meetings, Mentoring, Awareness regarding COVID19 by video messages and using Social Media Platforms to engage Community digitally. Youth completed their online SAP and engaged their community in positive change.

# Benazir Bhutto Shaheed Human Resource Research & Development Board [BBSHRRDB]:

Women Development Foundation Pakistan-WDFP has its very own vocational training center named "Women Skill Development Center" WSDC in Maripur, which is certified from

Trade Testing Board-TTB and Sindh Technical Education and Vocational Training Authority-STEVTA for carrying out certified courses.

Vocational classes resumed from 15 September 2020 and all trainees were following SOP's strictly.

32 students learnt stitching and beautician (16/each course). On 29 September 2020, Ms. Kanwal-Coordinator attended career counseling session with students at

Muhammad Shafi Educational Complex Shershah. Continuously team was in coordination during lockdown with supervisors and beneficiaries. WDFP organized Certificate Distribution Ceremony to encourage and motivate the trainees; BBSHRRDB team also participated in the ceremony.
